Search for an elusive number uncovers stories that count

It was the question Shannon Lovelady could not bear to see go unanswered: how many West Australians were killed at Gallipoli?

When author Susan Maushart posed it, it quickly became apparent that the number was unclear but fell somewhere between the 900 confirmed fatalities and the 2500 wounded or missing.

Ms Lovelady, a historian and archivist, found the challenge irresistible: "I just thought we should know that number."

So in June 2013, she launched the Gallipoli Dead from Western Australia project. It took almost 18 months of exhaustive research, countless hours from volunteers, consultations with medical experts, checking and cross-checking, to arrive at the elusive number.

In recognition, the Returned and Services League WA will release 1023 red balloons from the Bell Tower at the end of the Anzac Day commemorative service on Saturday.

WA was the only State to have such a list of its Gallipoli fallen, Ms Lovelady said. It shows the average age of those killed was 26 and most were from the 11th and 16th battalions and the 10th Light Horse Regiment.

Hundreds died in the first five weeks and in August 1915, in the attack on Leane's Trench and the charge at the Nek.

Ms Lovelady said her focus was on the list but the stories of the soldiers also emerged from the notes coming back from the volunteer researchers.

Despite her attempts to remain detached, she said one story in particular stayed with her: that of

Henry Wallis Williams and his friend Keiran Anderson.

Both men signed up to the 16th Battalion and were assigned to different companies. But Williams reassured Anderson's mother he would look after the younger man, and so boarded the boat with that company, rather than his own.

The transfer paperwork wasn't completed before both were killed at Gallipoli, one seen slumped over the other. As a result, Williams was recorded as absent without leave and then branded a deserter.

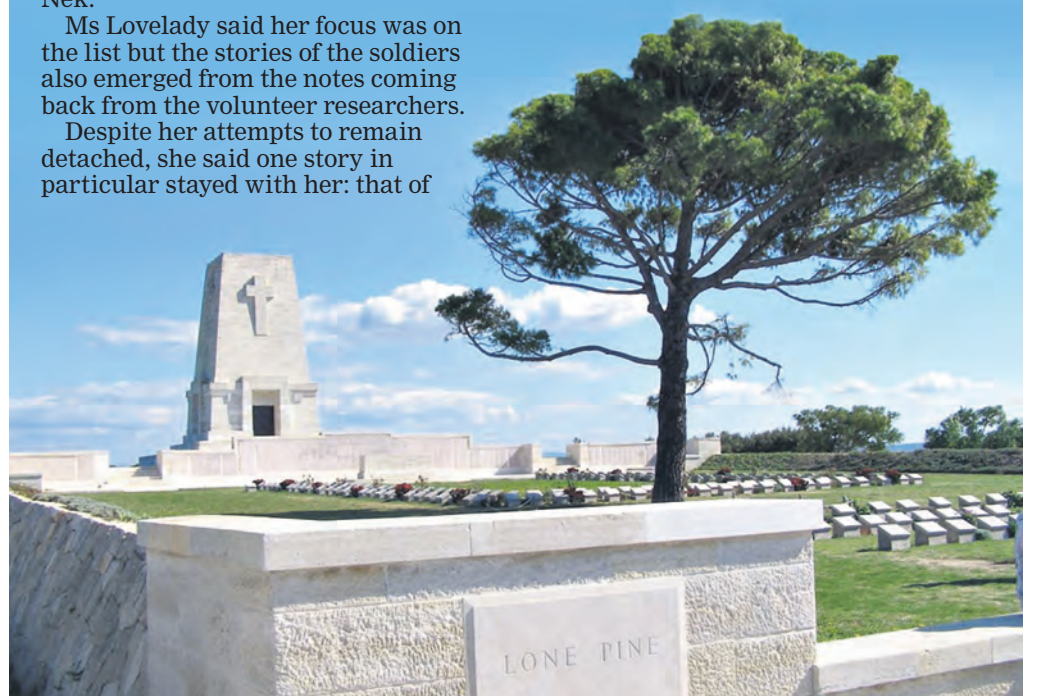
It wasn't until 1922 that his identification badges were found at the site and he was reassessed as killed in action.

Williams' parents had died but Anderson's mother was alive to hear that her son and his friend were together at the end.

"Lest we forget — that's what this is about," Ms Lovelady said. "I like bringing these men out into the light so everyone can see them."

"Now I want the database to be freely available to people, where they can search by names, occupations, battalion, and cause of death. It would be so useful."

The criteria for inclusion were necessarily strict: the person must have been born in WA, enlisted here or lived here. They must have died before August 31, 1921 as a direct result of their service in Gallipoli.
